#### I. CALL TO ORDER

- A. Senior Network Systems Engineer
  - i. Nelson did not have much to report. The usual delays and problems with the supply chain are still impacting the PC order, although some items have started to trickle in.

#### C. System Administrator

- i. Wymer reported that the updates to Borrower Registration standards are live on the Source. A word version of the standards is available for any members that want to customize the examples to be specific to their jurisdiction.
- ii. Merced and Fresno County are going to be setting up the OverDrive Magazines eRC connector. Wymer signed and returned the quote this week
- iii. The data extract modifications in BlueCloud Analytics were implemented.
- iv. Wymer reported this year's Meraki Access Point renewals were quoted higher than anticipated. He's worked with Nelson and SJVLS's Business Manager to figure out how to reallocate funds to pay for the licenses. Options are going to be presented to Admin Council on Friday.
- v. Wymer informed the committee that SirsiDynix will be including driver's license as a field in BC Central and MobileStaff in an upcoming release. This will remove a big roadblock to using either platform.

## Continuing Teleconferences Under Amended Brown Act

## **BACKGROUND**

March 4 - Governor Newsom declared a State of Emergency for COVID 19.

Executive Order N-29-20 authorized exceptions to the Brown Act to allow virtual public meetings.

Executive Order N-08-21 extended the previous order until 9/30/21.

AB 361 amended the Brown Act to make it easier to hold virtual meetings during declared emergencies, like the pandemic. The bill was signed 9/15/21 and went into effect immediately. The amended regulations clarify the rules and restrictions on the use of teleconferencing to conduct meetings. Previously, paragraph 3 of subdivision b in Gov Code section 54953, allowed meetings to be held through teleconference if:

- Agendas were posted at all teleconference locations
- Each teleconference location is identified in the notice and agenda of the meeting
- Each teleconference location shall be accessible to the public.
- A quorum of members of the legislative body shall participate from locations within the boundaries of the territory that the body exercises jurisdiction.

Paragraph 1 of subdivision e exempts those requirements, if:

- The meeting is held during a proclaimed state of emergency and local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing.
- The meeting is held during a proclaimed state of emergency holds a meeting for the purpose of determining, by majority vote, whether because of the emergency, meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health or safety of attendees.

The proclaimed State of Emergency is still active, even after most of the COVID-related Executive Orders were rescinded.
