2. Fresno County Cybersecurity Needs Assessment
 - i. Walden from County of Fresno ITSD provided an overview of B Riley Advisory Services to work with SJVLS's staff in conducting empirical testing on the SJVLS network system. This is conducted to see how safe our system is against attacks. The cost is covered by the County of Fresno. The Council was in favor of this, and we have never had it conducted before, so everyone thought it was needed.
 1. Motion made to move forward with Cybersecurity Needs Assessment Cervantes (Porterville)
 2. Seconded by Lewis (Kern).
3. Fiber Project: CENIC Year 8
 - i. Fiber project CENIC Year 8 is looking for approval of system participation in year 8 Broadband initiative in upcoming fiscal year. To authorize to collect bids, execute contract for E-rate and other related documents for eligible members. Authorize the Administrative Librarian or designee, to submit appropriate forms. To authorize Fiscal Agent to budget estimate appropriation and estimate revenues in the upcoming recommended budget. This will allow SJVLS to work with Ed Technology, CENIC and Califa to collect bids, review with members and process paperwork to participate in Year 8. There is no increase in membership fees as the project will be funded by E-Rate and Member's Tech Reserve
 1. Motion made to approve all 4 items Bath (Fresno).
 2. Seconded by Cervantes (Porterville).
4. Porterville Re-Opening Project
 - i. Requesting retroactively authorize Fiber project for Porterville Re-Opening in the amount of \$100,000 effective January 31, 2022. Seeking approval and authorization the chairman to submit SJVLS grant application to California State Library for possible revenue funding to reconnect Porterville. To Approve budget resolution increasing FY 2022-23 appropriations and estimated revenues for the communication phase of project in the amount of \$62,000. Approval will support System's purchase order issued over the past two months to begin process to order construction related items (access points, cabling and switching) and data drop in the amount of \$38,000. The communication phase for circuit in the amount of \$62,000 (includes contingency for possible inflation increases) will be budgeted in the upcoming recommended budget per budget resolution. Grant. Application will be submitted, and staff will return to board for acceptance of grand award and revenue funding.

Looking for retroactively approve the Administrative Librarian or their designee, to sign 470 forms and related documents for discounted equipment and services under SPURR Form 470 220002709. Seeking approval and authorization acceptance of estimated revenues funding from E-Rate category 2 funding and individual member's Tech Reserves. Looking to approve budget resolution increasing FY 1011-12 appropriations and estimated revenues in the amount of \$29,478.57. There is not increase in membership fees, and it is a one-time cost. Raman requested that Kevin explain SPURR to the Council.

3. Administrative Librarian
- i. Wymer provided an update on the progress of ECF Funding. Wymer is working on procedures for handling the funding as well as working with EdTechnologyFunds to address a clerical error that was made on Kern County's application. Wymer also provided and on the requirement to track circulation of ECF devices. Previously, Wymer believed device circulation would need to be tracked the entire time the devices were in circulation, but circulation only needs to be tracked for the one year of service funded by ECF. After the one year of service is completed, the records need to be retained for 10 years, but further circulation of the devices does not have to be tracked. As a result, Wymer is thinking of a simpler approach to record this information.
 - ii. Wymer has also been working with the other Cooperative System Administrators and the State Library to update the Annual Plan of Service forms for next fiscal year. The changes are not that significant but are intended to allow the State Library to better track how funding is allocated and expended.
 - iii. Wymer reported that he was contacted by Equinox with a Public Records Request for documents related to the LMS RFP. He is working with SJVLS's attorney to finalize the response.
 - iv. Wymer also reported the 20-21 CENIC E-Rate disbursement was received. He worked to verify the disbursement and is asking CENIC for clarification on some discrepancies he observed. It appears like credits and expenses for 20-21 were billed in the first quarter 21-22 invoice and not reflected in the 20-21 summary.
 - v. Wymer's final update was to inform Admin Council that the State Library is transitioning E-Rate billing from Califa to a new entity, CTC Technology and Energy. This will require us to sign new agreements.
4. SJVLS – System Administrator
- i. Wymer informed Admin Council that SJVLS had 3 JSA's leave their positions in the last month for various reasons and is working to train their replacements.
 - ii. Wymer provided an update on circulation of the new State Library Park Passes. The Automation Committee discussed the topic at their meeting and decided that borrowers in good standing can check out passes from the library jurisdiction where they are registered but will not be able to check out passes from jurisdictions where they are not registered. Each member will be able to decide if patrons can place requests on the passes.
 - iii. Wymer provided an update on the Library Card order. It closed the previous week. At this time there are 12,000 cards being ordered for 4 SJVLS members.

- iv. Wymer provided an update on the Palace Project from the State Library. Kern County previously reached out to ask about participating. Wymer asked the electronic resources Committee to evaluate including the SJVLS cloud library collection and participation in the project. Once they make a decision, they will return with a recommendation to Administrative Council
- 5. Senior Network Systems Engineer
 - i. Nelson reminded everyone that the the PC order is open, prices changing daily. Hoping for good delivery timetables. We already have over 100.

E. DIRECTOR'S COMMENTS

1. Wegener (Tulare County) The Board approved a cost-of-living increase across the board. It will be effective in July. Everyone in the library will get one. We also have a staff promotion. Celebrating World Book Day on April 23rd, it is an outside day.
2. Clark (Tulare City) we brought back the Garden Festival last Saturday. Molly delivered 3rd boy; she will be back end of June. Have a vacancy that needs to be filled. We have received many calls about the State Park passes. Zip books up and running. Proclamation at City Council for National Library Week.
3. Cervantes (Porterville) We are getting furniture next week, and installed by end of April, there will be some missing due to the supply and demand issue. Thanked Chris and whole team for Network connection. We are having a community event on April 30th, outside. Our graphics for mobile van is in. Cervantes did get served for the trial on the fire, she requested good vibes from everyone. .
4. Bath (Fresno) Business as usual, our rural branches are doing really well, Metro's till a little slow. We still plan on building two libraries, Clovis and Reedley. We are hoping by 2024. We will start working on renewing Measure B in 2026
5. Lewis (Kern) been working on purchasing technology. We need to work with County IT and get them out to branches. All branches open except for one. Filed for Infrastructure Grant and hope we get it. Sheri Wade has been working on getting a van, trying to get grant money to finish the project. All CoOuny employees received a 4 ½% raise, the first in 10 years. .
6. Rencher (Kings) The mobile library approved final wrap; last communication is that it will be delivered in June. Received grants, for Día de los Ninos. Library lunch in the library, partnering. Avenal, Strathmore, and Kettleman City. Turned the park passes over to staff so they can work on it at the staff meeting next week. Our county two years ago we got a job classification and jump. They are looking at it again and compaction issues. Central Valley needs to bump it up. We are all opened back up. We got zip books grant. Did walk for my doctoral, it was just incredible, I had about 20 family members. .
Taylor (Merced) We are still hiring, Librarians. In person programming and getting scheduled for summer reading and working on getting back into classrooms. Securing contracts and performers. We got a billboard for Adult Literacy. It was very costly, but really is doing a good job, it will be up for 1 year and we can change it 4 times.

SUBJECT: Financial Update Report

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

Approve acceptance of monthly financial update for the period of July 1, 2021, through April 30, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact associated with the recommended action. SJVLS JPA funds are held by Fresno County as the fiscal agent and provides contracted controller and accounting services. All County related costs associated with the fiscal administration are funded with funds set aside for planning and evaluation administration.

FINANCIAL UPDATE REPORT

A. FINANCIAL REPORTS

1. FY 2021/22 As of April 30, 2022, Financial reported expenses are \$ 2,338,288. Overall expenses were underspent by 36% in comparison to the monthly benchmarks due to delays in Califa quarterly telecommunication charges, delivery, and fiber upgrade project costs for total \$350,000.
2. Revenue Collected: \$2,551,578 represents 66% of collected funds. The billing to Members for Telecommunications was processed in March 2022. Due to the timing of the Board meeting, the final revenue report for April was not available from Fresno County ACTTC.

B. OUTSTANDING RECEIVABLE TOTAL: \$557,201

1. FY 2021/22 Member Fees, Postage, and Smart Net totaling \$ 1,769,999 was billed on August 17, 2021. This has been paid in full as of April 25, 2022.
2. Billed Fortinet of \$31,000 on 8/17/21. This has been paid in full as of April 25, 2022.
3. FY 2021/22 Electronic Resources totaling \$344,589 has been billed with a current outstanding balance of \$22,446.
4. Madera extra delivery invoice \$12,692. This has been paid in full as of April 25, 2022.
5. FY 2021/22 Telco billing totaling \$534,755 was billed on March 15, 2022 with a current outstanding balance of \$68,700 as of April 25, 2022.

C. CLSA ALLOCATION UPDATE

1. On February 11, 2022, the Board approved an amendment to the operations service plan for a budget line transfer of funds from delivery to Meraki access points in the amount of \$31,548 and Online Materials Services in the amount of \$9,702 pending State approval of amended plan of service at May meeting. Members will pay a portion of the Meraki access points from Tech Reserves (\$16,700) and remainder from CLSA.
2. Expenses and Estimates: Total CLSA expenses estimated in the amount of \$235,800 with funding offset from CLSA \$235,672 and remainder from Fund balance \$128. For the Delivery service stops outside of CLSA funding, Madera has been billed based on route estimates of \$12,692, a slight decrease from budget estimate of \$13,000.
3. Funding Collected: CLSA award was increased from \$124,997 to \$235,672 in FY 2021/22. CLSA funds received from State as of January 26, 2022. The funds will be fully used.

D. ONLINE MATERIALS STATUS UPDATE

1. Online Materials expenses total \$169,066 with remaining unspent funds of \$23,006. This includes Additional Online Materials Resources in the amount of \$9,702 to be spent from CLSA funds was approved by the Board on February 11, 2022 pending State approval of the amended plan of service. The unused amount will be spent on Cloud Library.

E. LSTA – PUBLIC LIBRARY STAFF EDUCATION PROGRAM (PLSEP) MLS FUNDING SUPPORT

1. FY 21-22 award of \$9,385 has been fully expended by March 24, 2022.
2. March expenditures submitted for reimbursement. SJVLS Administration reimbursement of \$853; \$8,532 disbursement to two participants in the program.
3. Award terms date range: July 1, 2021 through July 31, 2022.
4. PLSEP funds received from State as of December 30, 2021.
5. PLSEP Mid Project Financial Report submitted to the State on April 7, 2022.

F. TRANSFER OF OWNERSHIP

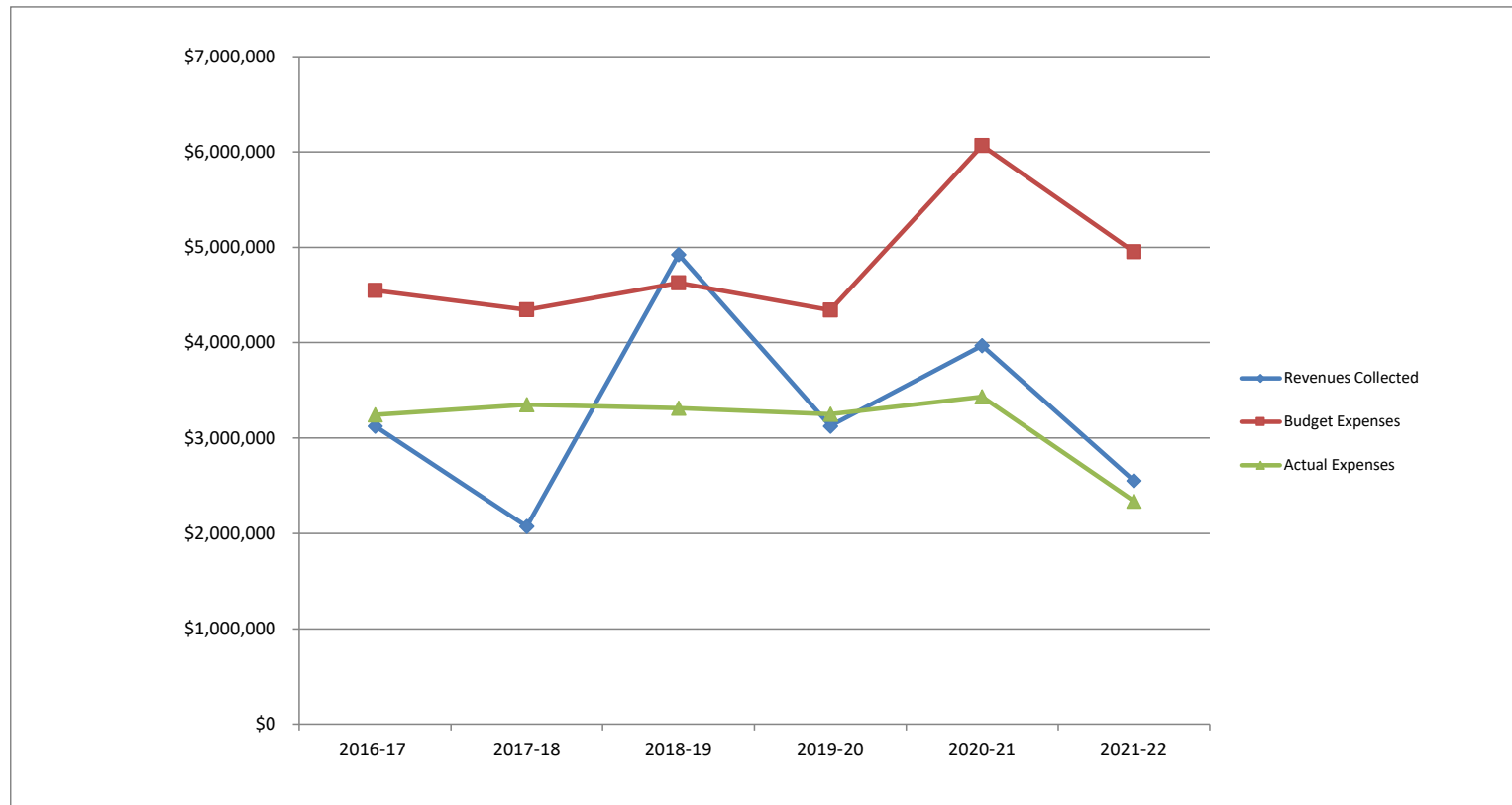
1. Total balance - \$3,928,936. Emailed to Admin Council

 - i. CENIC Year 7 estimates by participating member are listed for grand total of \$94,000 and Wi-Fi access points for each member for one year renewal \$16,700.

H. UNEARNED GRANT REPORT & Broadband Projects

1. There are no unearned grant awards available for year 6 and 7.
2. Fiber Project CENIC Year 6 is in the final stages. Total project costs for sites completed is \$176,296. Fiscal will be sending statements to Fresno, Kern, Kings, Mariposa, and Merced no later than June 2022.
3. Fiber Project Year 7. In progress. The Board approved on April 16, 2021 for SJVLS participation in CENIC Year 7 in the upcoming fiscal year with equipment recommendations in the amount of \$94,000. Staff will return to the Board in the fall to report on final cost, any grant opportunities and upgrade of equipment to be deducted from participating members' tech reserves. Members elected to use a portion of recent E-Rate disbursement as Committed towards Year 7. Please refer to Tech Reserve if a participating member.

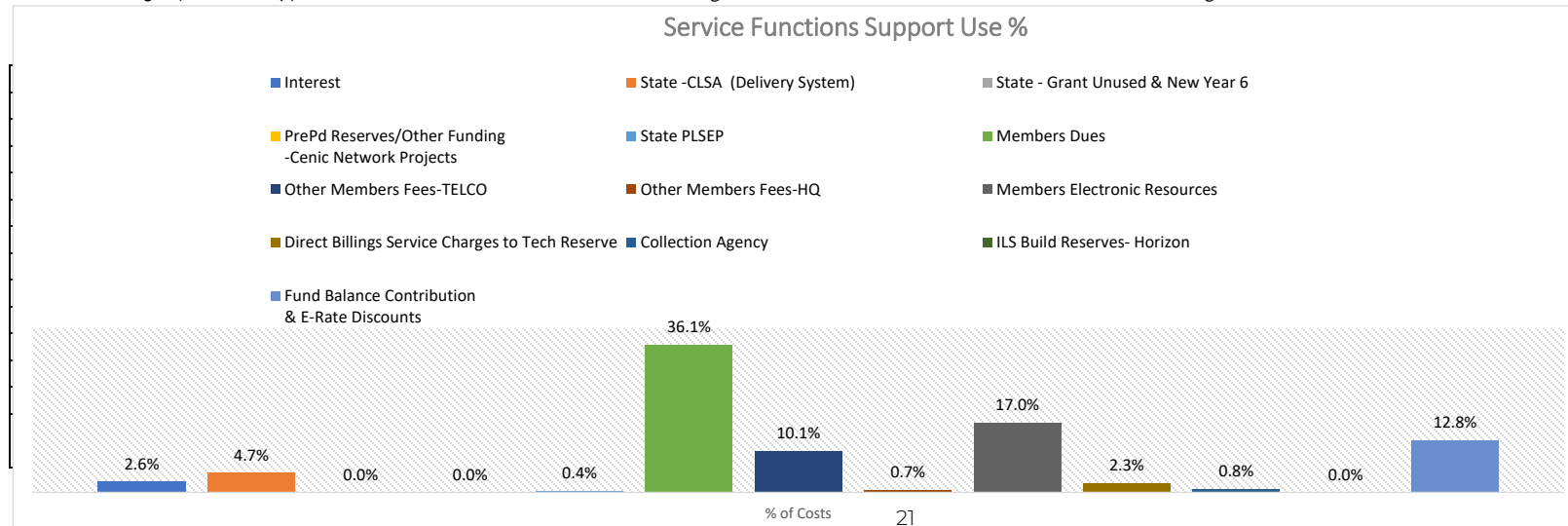
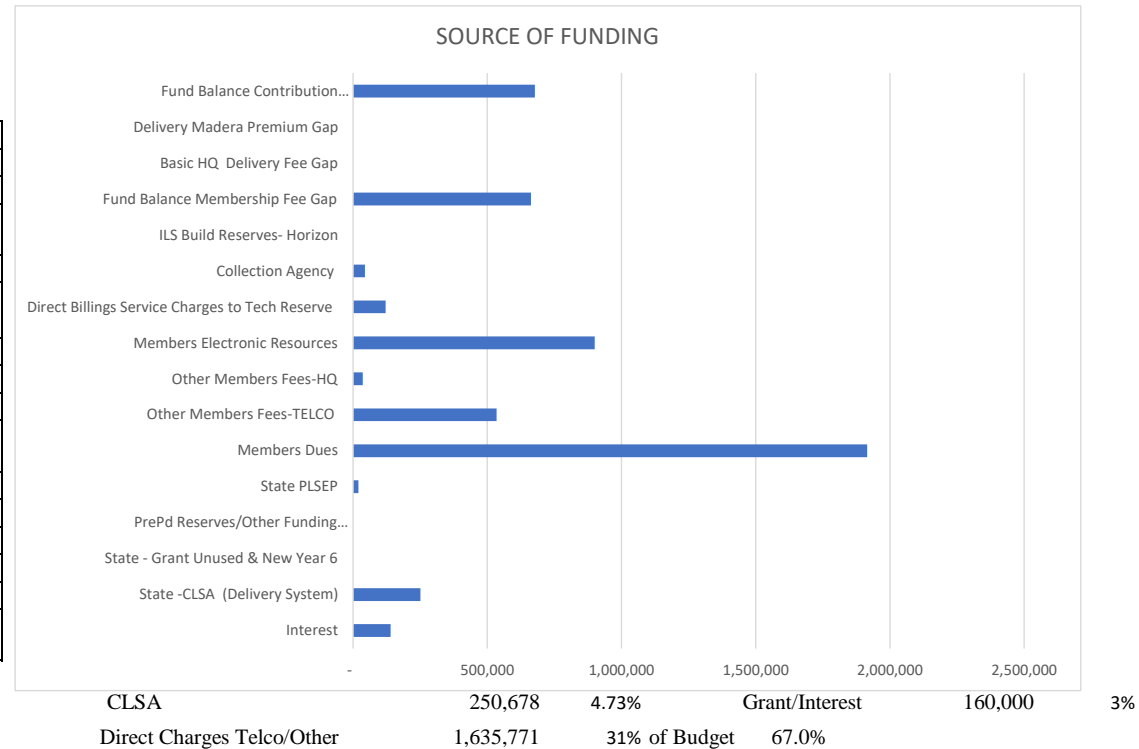

SUBJECT: Defer 2020 State Broadband Grant Funding

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

1. Approval to defer the 2020 High-Speed Broadband Grant Application that was submitted November 6, 2020.
2. Authorize the Administrative Librarian or their designee to prepare and submit an updated application for Broadband Grant funding when CTC's grant window opens in the amount of at least \$375,801.
3. Approve and authorize the Chair to sign the new grant application.

Approval of the recommended action will authorize the Administrative Librarian to inform the State Library that SJVLS will defer our 2020 application for Broadband Grant Funding and allow the Administrative Librarian to re-apply when the next funding window opens. The Administrative Librarian will return to the board for the approval of the final award and agreement.

ALTERNATIVE ACTION(S):

There are no viable alternative actions at this time.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Approving this request will not increase membership fees or require any funding to be returned to the State Library, as no awards have been issued. If funding cannot be secured during the second funding opportunity, members would have the option to use funds from their tech reserves to pay for necessary upgrades. A summary of available funding is included with this attachment.

DISCUSSION:

At the November 6, 2020, Administrative Council meeting the board approved the submission of the High-Speed Broadband Grant application to the State Library in the amount of \$375,801, to cover the costs of broadband upgrades across the system. The grant funding was intended to provide gap funding to offset the costs of upgrades not covered by E-Rate category 2 funding and required a Funding Commitment Decision Letter (FCDL) from USAC before the State Library could determine how much gap funding to provide. SJVLS's category 2 FCDL is currently still under review and is delayed because of a clerical error made by USAC. The funding for this program is administered by Califa, who will no longer be performing these duties for the State after the end of the 2021-2022 fiscal year, and Califa is under a deadline to get all grant funds encumbered before June. As a result, Califa cannot continue to hold funds aside while SJVLS waits for a category 2 FCDL and needs to award these funds to other projects.

A second round of funding, overseen by the State's new broadband program administrator, CTC Energy and Technology, will open next fiscal and, SJVLS will be able to re-submit our grant application for the new round of funding.

**AGREEMENT BETWEEN SAN JOAQUIN VALLEY LIBRARY SYSTEM AND
COLUMBIA TELECOMMUNICATIONS CORPORATION
FOR THE PROVISION, INSTALLATION AND MAINTENANCE OF
ADVANCED NETWORK (DATA) SERVICES**

This Agreement, hereinafter referred to as “Agreement”, is entered into as of **DATE** by and between Columbia Telecommunications Corporation d/b/a CTC Technology and Energy, hereinafter referred to as “CTC” and the San Joaquin Valley Library System, a joint powers agency, hereinafter referred to as “Library”. CTC and Library are sometimes referred to in this Agreement individually as “Party” and collectively as “Parties”. All written communications between the parties shall be addressed as follows unless and until amended in writing by the respective party.

WITNESS THAT

WHEREAS, CTC, is the Statewide Broadband Access Administrator for the California State Library Broadband Services Project (“Project”); and

WHEREAS, CTC, on behalf of the California State Library, has contracted with the Corporation for Education Network Initiatives in California (“CENIC”) and its subsidiaries to provide high speed networking to libraries in California; and

WHEREAS, Library desires to enter into an agreement with CTC to obtain one or more data circuits to connect Library to the CENIC high speed broadband fiber network, CalREN, and, if specified in Appendix #1, attached, to connect Library to other library sites as identified in said Appendix for the purpose of connecting to CalREN.

NOW THEREFORE, Library and CTC enter into this Agreement:

1. Purpose

It is the purpose of this Agreement to set forth the terms and conditions applicable to the provision of communications and related network services to Library under the Project.

2. Services to be Provided

Parties understand that the primary communications infrastructure provided by CENIC is the California Research and Education Network (“CalREN”). Services that CENIC will provide to Libraries will include use of CalREN and contracting for and provision of data circuits supplied by network service providers.

CTC, on behalf of Library, will contract with CENIC for such data circuits. Specific circuits and their costs are included in the Appendix #1 attached which may be amended from time to time by mutually signed Addenda (“Services”). CTC assures Library that CENIC or CTC will notify Library of installation requirements and necessary maintenance instructions. Neither CENIC nor CTC shall be responsible for operating or maintaining software, equipment or cabling that connects equipment or network services not provided by CENIC for the Services unless specifically agreed to in writing by CENIC.

Parties agree to provide notice to the other Party within 10 calendar days of a failure by CENIC or the network service provider to deliver Services, or otherwise comply with the terms as described in this Agreement, including Appendix #1 and subsequent Addenda. If noticed non-performance is not cured in a timely manner, Parties agree to meet within 10 days of said notice and discuss appropriate remedies including but not limited to cancellation of related services or service credits as specified in the underlying agreements between CENIC and its network service provider and CTC and CENIC.

Library is responsible for calculating and paying any early termination penalties that might apply due to cancellation of existing connections so that it may receive Services under this Agreement.

Library is responsible for completing, signing, and submitting any required Letter of Agency, or related documentation, to confirm its participation in and eligibility for the E-rate Consortia and to authorize CENIC, as the E-rate Consortia lead, to act on its behalf as described under the Letter of Agency for the purpose of securing E-rate discounts.

Library is further responsible for completing, signing, and submitting any responsible Letter of Authorization, or related documentation, to the California Public Utilities Commission to authorize CTC and CENIC to act on its behalf to submit an application and supporting documentation for the purpose of receiving discounts on eligible network services as part of the California Teleconnect Fund program.

If Library is currently receiving E-rate funding for its existing services, Library remains responsible for continuing to apply for that E-rate funding until all CENIC Services are turned up and existing E-rate supported services are canceled.

3. Term and Termination of this Agreement

- (a) **TERM OF THIS AGREEMENT.** This Agreement shall be in effect from **DATE** until the termination of all Services including the circuits ordered under this Agreement (as defined in Appendix #1: CENIC Circuit Quote and any subsequent Addenda under this Agreement), or unless otherwise terminated by a Party pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. Specific terms for the circuits provided pursuant to this Agreement shall depend on the specific date such circuit is “handed off” to Library pursuant to Appendix #1 or subsequent Addenda or as noticed in writing by CENIC to Library.
- (b) **TERMINATION.** Termination of this Agreement prior to the end date of any given circuit, as described in Appendix #1 or subsequent Addenda, shall result in Library paying any applicable circuit telecommunications carrier termination charges or similar early termination charges that CTC incurs under its agreement with CENIC resulting from early termination of the Service.

- (c) Notwithstanding the above, upon a sixty (60) day written notice prior to the second and each following June 30 after a circuit is installed, Library may cancel a circuit without penalty if it verifies to CTC and CENIC that funding to pay for that circuit is not available and Library agrees that for at least 12 months after said notice it will not order or otherwise obtain a replacement circuit or substantially similar services in place of the cancelled circuit.
- (d) Library may terminate this Agreement with no penalty if non-recurring, one-time costs for all circuits included in Appendix #1 and any subsequent Addenda are materially increased by the telecommunications carrier from the amount shown in Appendix #1.
- (e) CTC may terminate this Agreement or assign its rights and responsibilities under this Agreement to a third party upon no less than sixty (60) day written notice to Library, in the event of termination or expiration of its duties and obligations under the Project and with written approval of the California State Library.

4. Payment

CTC bills quarterly in arrears. Payment for services shall be due within forty-five (45) days of receipt of a CTC invoice reflecting provision of the services for which the invoice is sent; or as otherwise agreed to by Library and CTC. Except for non-recurring costs, if any, costs in Appendix #1 and any subsequent Addenda shall only begin upon installation of circuit(s). Library will put forth reasonable efforts to make payments within forty-five (45) days after receipt of invoice. Library understands and agrees that CTC will only make payment to CENIC for services upon receipt of related payments from Library. If Library fails to make payments within forty-five (45) days after receipt of invoice, it agrees to pay any reasonable late payment fees incurred by CTC under its agreement with CENIC.

Unless otherwise agreed to between the Parties, all circuit deployment fees, if any as set forth in Appendix #1 and subsequent Addenda are non-cancelable and nonrefundable. Upon termination of this Agreement, or any Services provided under this Agreement, any outstanding circuit deployment fees, outstanding recurring charges, non-recurring fees, applicable circuit termination charges, and applicable early termination penalties, shall become due and payable immediately upon termination.

5. Miscellaneous

- (a) **CONDITIONS OF USE.** Library agrees to conform to the CENIC Appropriate Use Policy located at <https://cenic.org/network/policies/acceptable-use-policy> (revised September 13, 2004) and to any specific conditions of use imposed by network service providers or subcontractors providing communications services to CENIC as may be in force at the time such services are made available, including pursuant to an Addendum to this Agreement. If CENIC, subcontractors, or network service provider conditions of use are modified, Library will be notified and if Library believes it can no longer conform to their requirements, Library shall have one hundred eighty (180) days from the notice of the modification to terminate the affected Service(s) without penalty. Library must provide a 30-day written notice of its termination under this provision to CTC and CENIC. If Library does not elect to terminate the Service(s), Library must conform to the revised conditions of use. If Library fails to conform to the revised conditions of use, the Services may be subject to termination upon sixty (60) day notice to Library from CTC or CENIC.

- (b) **CONFLICTING CLAUSES.** If any clause in this Master Agreement is in conflict with a clause in an Addendum to this Agreement, the language in the Addendum shall take precedence only for the service defined in that Addendum.
- (c) **FORCE MAJEURE.** Neither Party shall be responsible for performance of its obligations hereunder where prevented, delayed, or hindered by war, riots, embargoes, strikes involving third parties, acts of third party communications service providers, including any local access provider, or of their vendors, or suppliers unrelated to the services offered under this Agreement, acts of unrelated third parties, accidents, cable cuts by third parties not related to services provided under this Agreement, natural disasters, act(s) of God or any other event beyond the reasonable control of the Parties.
- (d) **GOVERNING LAW.** The laws of the State of California shall govern this Agreement.
- (e) **NON-LIBRARY USES:** Library understands that this agreement covers only library use of CalREN and of circuits provided hereunder and Library agrees that no other uses will be made of the services provided herein.

6. Entire Agreement

This Agreement and any Addenda contemporaneously or subsequently executed by the parties constitute the entire Agreement between the parties regarding the subject matter of this Agreement and supersede all prior written or oral agreements with respect to such. This Agreement may not be modified orally, and no modification or amendment shall be binding unless in writing and signed by authorized representatives of both parties.

7. General Provisions

7.1 Nondiscrimination: During the performance of this Agreement,

- (a) CTC and its subcontractors shall not deny the Agreement's benefits to any person on the basis of religion, color, ethnic group identification, sex, age, physical or mental disability, nor shall they discriminate unlawfully against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, physical handicap, mental disability, medical condition, marital status, age (over 40) or sex.
- (b) CTC shall ensure that the evaluation and treatment of employees and applicants for employment are free of such discrimination.

7.2 Severability: It is expressly agreed and understood by the Parties hereto that if any provision of this Agreement is held to be or invalid under any applicable statute or rule of law, it is deemed to that extent to be omitted. However, the balance of the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

7.3 Rights and Remedies: The rights and remedies of the Parties provided herein shall not be exclusive and are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.

7.4 Prior Agreements: Library agrees that any prior agreements entered into between any entity that previously served as the Broadband Administrator and the Library for the purpose of participating in the CENIC E-Rate Consortium or receiving services pursuant to that program has been terminated.

- 8. Indemnification.** Library agrees to indemnify, defend and save harmless CTC, its, officers, agents and employees from any and all claims, losses, and liabilities accruing or resulting to CTC and any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials or supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by Library in the performance of this Agreement, but only in proportion to and in the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of Library, its officers, agents, or employees. CTC agrees to indemnify, defend, and save harmless Library, its trustees, officers, agents and employees from any and all liabilities accruing or resulting to Library and any and all contractors, subcontractors, suppliers, laborers and any other person, firm or corporation furnishing or supplying work services, materials or supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement, and from any and all claims and losses accruing or resulting to any person, firm or corporation who may be injured or damaged by CTC in the performance of this Agreement, but only in proportion to and in the extent such liability, loss, expense, attorneys' fees, or claims for injury or damages are caused by or result from the negligent or intentional acts or omissions of CTC, its officers, agents, or employees.
- 9. Binding Arbitration.** The parties agree that any disputes between them regarding their respective rights and obligations hereunder shall be resolved by negotiations, but if not so resolved, shall be resolved by binding arbitration pursuant to Code of Civil Procedure section 1280 et seq., with the non-prevailing party responsible for the arbitrator's fee, but in all other respects with each side bearing its own costs and attorneys fees.

Appendix #1

Provision, Installation and Maintenance Of Advanced Network (Data) Services: Reimbursement of Circuit Costs

This Appendix lists the circuits contracted for by CENIC on behalf of CTC and the Library for connecting CENIC's fiber optic backbone to Library and for library connections that are not direct connections to CENIC's fiber optic backbone, e.g. direct connections between libraries (defined as "Services" in the Agreement). Library understands that CENIC will bill CTC, and CTC will bill Library, for the costs of circuits charged by network service providers, including any taxes and surcharges, and any one-time installation fees. Prior to approval of CENIC's E-rate Consortium Library Application, not all applicable E-rate and CTF discounts will be reflected on invoices. After the E-rate Application for any given year is approved, the network service provider will coordinate with CENIC to provide appropriate credits and such credits will be passed from CENIC to CTC and from CTC to the Library. Such credits are typically issued sometime during the fiscal year after the year in which the circuits are installed and Services are first provided. In subsequent years, credits continue to be issued in the fiscal year after the year for which Services have been provided. Library further understands that the exact discounted cost of circuits will not be known until after the E-rate Consortium Library Application is approved. The actual start date of the Service, and therefore of circuit costs, will be dependent on coordination among CENIC, the Library and the network service provider. Any one-time (Non-recurring or NRC) costs included below are typically invoiced by carriers prior to circuit installation and will be invoiced to Library upon receipt of invoice to CENIC from the network service provider.

Building Forward Infrastructure Funding for California Libraries

The first round of applications for this program closed on **March 21, 2022**.

There is \$439 million in one-time funds in the Building Forward Library Infrastructure program to assist public libraries in economically challenged areas around the state. The 2021-2022 budget sets these priorities for use of the funds:

1. Projects addressing life safety and other critical maintenance needs; and

2. Projects serving high poverty areas of the state.

Other library infrastructure projects may be considered if funding remains after priority projects have been evaluated.

Awards are expected to be announced in Spring 2022. Those who do not receive grants during the first round will be automatically considered in the next round of applications. The maximum grant a library can receive is \$10 million. Funds must be used by March 31, 2026.
